

The sculpture honors all canines that have partnered with police officers to provide safety & security for the

Edina community. The lifelike sculpture stands sentinel over all the commemorative plaques of each dog that has served on Edina's Police Force. The Edina Club made a \$5,000 contribution for the creation and completion of this bronze sculpture that is located in a lovely garden setting just outside the Police Station and City Hall.

Edina's canines, mostly German Shepherds, are imported from Europe. Community donations help offset the cost of acquiring one of these special animals. In 2006, the Edina Club contributed \$22,000 to assist with acquiring Canine Officer 'Kodiak'.

Chair..."Hello Everyone! I hope you are
having a great summer and getting time

to spend with your families. I am changing hats this year from Education Chair to being your Legislation & Public Policy Chair. I just wanted to bring a couple things to everyone's attention:

✓Don't forget to vote in the MN primaries! Circle August 14th on your calendar. This will give you an opportunity to determine the names that will be showing up on the ballots in the General Election on November 6th. Minnesota has early voting for the primaries (you do not have to have an excuse). You can vote at your local court house, your local Polling Place or request a ballot by mail. If you have changed your name, changed your address, or have just turned eighteen, you will need to register to vote. Minnesota also has same-day voter registration.

✓ I know that GFWC-MN President, Jean Walker would love to hear Minnesota's name called out at the next GFWC Annual Convention as recipients of the Legislation/Public Policy Award! This can happen very easily but it will take every GFWC-MN Club Member. The award is given to the state that has the greatest increase of people signing up for the "GFWC Legislative Action Center". Simply go the gfwc.org website. On the home page, click on "What Do We Do?" That will take you to Public Policy. You will see a window that says "Legislative Action Center". Click on the tab that says "Join the Legislative Action Center (on the right side of the page)". Click "Join Now". Fill out the information sheet and be sure to click the "EMAIL OPT IN" box at the bottom of the page and register. I know that sounds like a lot of steps but it's pretty easy!

✓ Currently, we only need one more state to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment. (If you're like me, you probably thought that had happened). MN has ratified.

✓Volunteer to be an election judge. Training is going on right now. We can't claim those hours as we receive compensation for them. That should not, however, stop us from being willing to help in the democratic process."

There is an entry form that needs to be completed as well as a project notebook with pictures and supporting materials. Please note: The notebook will not be returned to you and will be housed in the Women's History and Resource Center (WHRC) in Washington DC., so don't forget to make a second copy for your club archives! Monetary awards are provided in each state as well as five awards are given nationally.
