


The "GFWC-MN 2019 EMPOWERING WOMAN" Program is the perfect way to say "Thank You" to an outstanding club member

They raised fourteen children on their dairy farm west of Waubun, MN where they lived for 51 years before retiring to Waubun. Lucille is survived by 13 children, 34 grandchildren, and 28 greatgrandchildren. She was preceded in death by one child and her husband.

Lucille was a long time member of the GFWC Medallion Club and was honored as a club "Empowering Woman". She was most active when Yvonne was a GFWC State Officer and through her GFWC State Presidency. Lucille loved sewing and sewed loads of items for GFWC fundraising projects such as totes, purses, bags for walkers,

and aprons. She also made the giant denim bag that holds the GFWC Emblem that is still being used for state meetings. She also sewed the denim bags that once held the GFWC state flag and flag stand.

When Lucille wasn't busy with GFWC, she worked as a hospice volunteer and a caregiver at an assisted living community. Milo and she received the 1981 "Valley Farmer and Homemaker Award". They also loved being an 'American mom and dad' to Manabu, a Japanese exchange student.

Lucille was a member of St. Ann's Catholic Church, serving as a Eucharistic Minister, Religious Ed. Teacher, and she held various offices in the Ladies Aid, Foresters, Catholic Daughters and Homemakers. Milo and she were honored as the 2017 "Northland Diocese Senior Couple" receiving the Bishop's Medal.

Lucille was a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. She was a caring and giving friend, and a pillar of strength and faith that carried her through the most difficult of times. She will be deeply missed by everyone that knew her.

IMPORTANT ALERT! "Spoofing" is happening to GFWC Members!

Unfortunately, an email like the sample shown below is finding its way into your inbox. Without closer inspection, it might be easy to mistake this as legitimate:

✓A name you recognize appears as the sender.

✓ It addresses you by name.

✓ The content (giving to those in need) is relevant to GFWC.

✓Spoofing is the practice of creating emails that aim to trick recipients into thinking it is from someone they know. It's a way for scammers to take advantage of you. If you receive an email requesting money or the purchase of items from what appears to be a fellow GFWC club member, ✓check the email address. In the sample, the email says it is from Mary Ellen Brock. But when you look at the email address, it's generic and does not match her real email address. That's the number one sign of a fraudulent email; always carefully check the source of suspicious emails like this one.
