Two Important Messages From Mona Gregersen, Our GFWC-MN Legislation & Public Policy Chair

★ GFWC strongly supports the passage of *H.R.1923*, the Women's History and the Nineteenth Amendment Centennial Quarter Dollar Coin Program Act. This bill will celebrate the centennial of the 19th Amendment by honoring the contributions of prominent women from each state, the District of Columbia, and U.S. territories (Similar to the 50 States Quarter Program). Beginning in 2021, this Act would create a new series of commemorative circulating coins which highlight women suffragists and other trailblazers on the reverse side of the U.S. quarter. GFWC members were at the forefront of women's suffrage with a delegation marching in the 1913 Suffrage Parade on Pennsylvania Ave., which began to change public opinion on suffrage. Many of the leaders of the suffrage movement were members of GFWC, including Carrie Chapman Catt, Jane Addams, and Lizzie Crozier French as well as former GFWC Presidents Ellen Henrotin and Sarah Decker Platt. A formal organizational endorsement came in 1914 with a resolution supporting the "political equality of men and women." Contact your members of Congress urging them to pass this bipartisan bill and visit the GFWC Legislative Action Center to express your support!



★ On February 13th, the U.S. House of Representatives voted to remove the deadline for ratification and to have the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) added as the 28th Amendment to the Constitution. Earlier in the week GFWC Programs staff attended a

hearing of the House Committee on Rules as well as a press event on the ERA held by Speaker of the House, Nancy Pelosi. Clubwomen across the nation used GFWC's Legislative Action Center to contact their members of Congress on this issue. This is a huge victory and **GFWC thanks you** for your support, but the work is not yet complete. We must now direct our attention to the U.S. Senate and urge them to take the same action as the House. "There can be no expiration date on equality," **Contact your Senator today!**

The **GFWC** Legislative Action Center is a powerful tool for GFWC's public issues and advocacy efforts. Track bills, contact your local representative, and take action on issues germane to GFWC Resolutions.

Haven't signed up yet? Go to the gfwc.org website to visit the Legislative Action Center and enroll to receive updates today! It is so simple to do, it only takes seconds, and don't worry you won't get flooded with dozens of unnecessary emails. Mona will even go one step better, if you email her your address and email address to mona@hcinet.net, She would be happy to sign you up! District Presidents and Club Presidents – having GFWC's collective voice heard by members of Congress is essential and the Legislative Action Center holds many of the answers. Please get the word out to all your club members and remind them to sign up.

★ On January 20th, the GFWC Nevis Women's Club (Nevis, MN), participated in the "GFWC Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service". Eight club members sewed 34 shields and 13 bags for Days for Girls. Their 'initiative' was a 'grand' total of 46.5 hours worth of sewing, not to mention, a great time was had by all the volunteers!

Days For Girls is an international nonprofit organization "turning periods into pathways". DfG increases access to menstrual care and education by developing global partnerships, cultivating social enterprises, mobilizing volunteers, and innovating sustainable solutions that shatter stigmas and limitations for women and girls. Together, they are creating a world with dignity, health, and opportunity for all. Their movement has reached more than one million girls — and counting! "With your help, DfG can reach Every Girl. Everywhere. Period."

Gloria N. Stroup 1930 - 2019



Sybil May Pearson, age 94, of Mahnomen, MN, died peacefully at the Mahnomen Health Center Nursing Home


