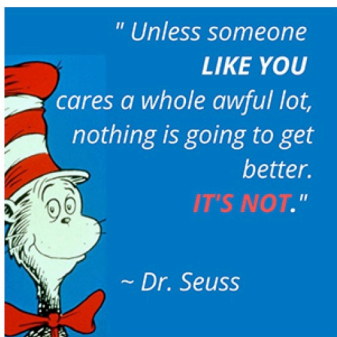

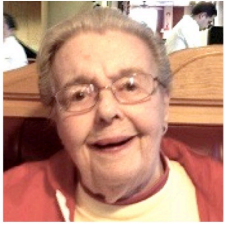
Edell T. Swanson
